

COMPLETED CONTRACT

Site and Location: Dublin Zoo Entrance Pavillion.



The OPW employed CLG to construct a new Entrance Pavilion at Dublin Zoo which included a shop, Entrance Kiosks, staff facilities and associated site works.

The new entrance building is a single storey pavilion, which forms a walled edge to the public domain of the park. The Building contains a retail outlet, an entrance area with ticket kiosks, and a cash office, management office, ATM room, staff wc's and kitchen/staffroom.

The separate built elements are unified by a single, over sailing steel flat roof structure with an American white oak timber soffit, supported on ten slender circular finned steel columns. The frame of the building consists of reinforced concrete infilled by blockwork and glazing. The building itself is finished externally with granite cladding. The foundations consist of piling with reinforced concrete strip foundation construction. Due to the building been located adjacent to a lake, retaining and remediation works were carried out to the side of the lake.
