

## COMPLETED CONTRACT

**Site and Location:** Cloverhill Prison, Clondalkin, Dublin 22.



The Irish Prison Service required the Conversion of Cell Blocks to individual Video Link up Booths for secure interaction with the courts. The purpose of the upgrade was so that prisoners did not have to be transferred to the courts during their trial process therefore cutting down on the cost of high security and the risk of prisoner and staff security in transit.

The works consisted of the partial demolition of an existing cell block building and alterations to the existing structure to provide a state of the art Video Conferencing Centre. This involved the construction of new holding cells, sound proof consultation video booth rooms with vandal proof furnishing and the installation of acoustic walls, doors and ceilings.

As part of the contract, existing cells were refurbished consisting of the installation of anti-ligature furniture, fittings, anti-vandal windows and the installation of vandal-proof low voltage fob remote control WC units.
